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

- → Time and curricula constraints (Nguyen & Newton, 2020; Levis, 2022)
- → Shyness among students (Trinh, Nguyen & Le, 2021)







English vs Vietnamese: Key Phonetic Differences





→ Help students practise the length difference between Vietnamese and English




